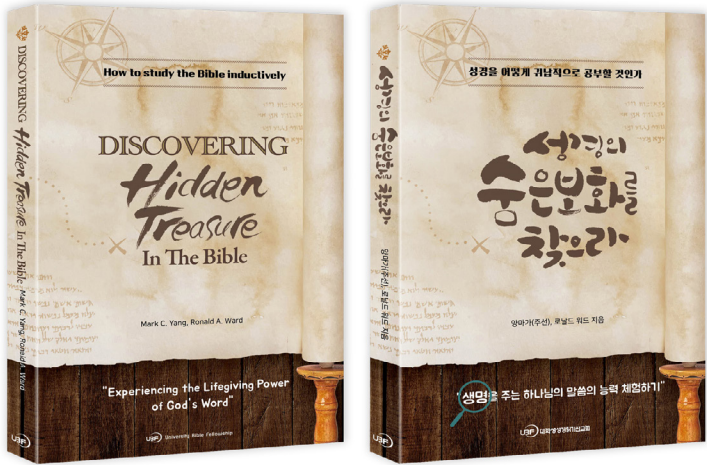

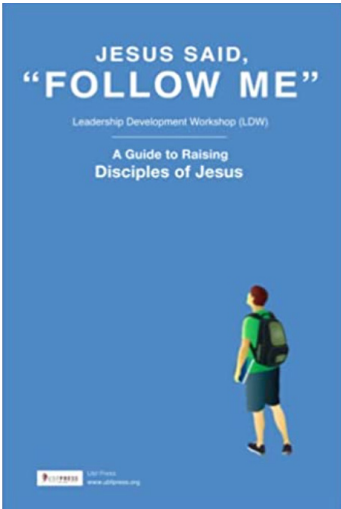

Discussion Questions for Thursday Evening (Ephesians 2)

As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, 2 in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient.... 4 But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, 5 made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. (Ephesians 2:1-4)

(A) What is one way that you have experienced the power of God to save you from the power of sin in your life? (10 min)

(B) What are some of the divisions/differences we face as we try to serve the work of God today? How do our divisions/differences compare to those between Jews and Gentiles in Paul’s time? (10 min)

“For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, 15 by setting aside in his flesh the law with its commands and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace...” (Ephesians 2:14-15)

Paul affirms that Christ “is” our peace, that he “has made” the two one and that he “has destroyed” the barriers between us.

(C) Given these facts, what should we conclude about the cause of the very real divisions that we experience among us? (10 min)

(D) According to this passage, how can we bridge and heal these very real divisions? (10 min)

TOGETHER WITH ONE VOICE GLORIFY GOD

Romans 15:1-13

Key Verse: 15:6, "so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

*Essential Question: How can God’s people glorify him as a community?

1. Read verses 1-2.

Who do you think Paul means by the “strong” and the “weak”? (cf. 14:1-2,17) Why is it difficult for the strong to bear with the failings of the weak? Why are we obligated to do so? Where can we see the “strong” bearing with the “weak” in ordinary life? How does this obligation conflict with our “rights-based” culture? What is God’s purpose in our sacrifice? (2; cf. 14:19-20)

2. Read verses 3-4.

How has Christ set the example for us? (3) As followers of Christ, what is our ultimate hope? (8:29; 1Jn 3:2) How do the Scriptures help us to endure in pursuing this hope? Why do we need this help? (Isa 55:8-9; Php 3:12)

3. Read verses 5-7.

What does it mean to have the “same attitude of mind” toward each other that Christ Jesus had? (cf. Php 2:3-5) Why is it difficult to do so? What do you think it means to have “one mind and one voice”? Why is it necessary? (6) Why does Paul pray to “the God who gives endurance and encouragement”? What else do we need to pray for? (7)

4. Read verses 8-12.

What are some of the promises of God that Christ has confirmed for his chosen people? (8) Why did he do so? How has God shown his mercy to the Gentiles? (9a) How can be we sure that it was always God’s plan to do so? (9b-12) How does God want Jews and Gentiles to glorify him? (10) What does he want us to learn here?

5. Read verse 13.

Where do true joy and peace come from? How can we experience them? How is the hope of God’s people different from that of worldly people? Where does our hope come from?

6. Read verse 6 again.

How can we glorify God together as a community in 2023? What can you do towards this goal? What should we pray for?

Romans 15:1-13 15 We who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak and not to please ourselves. 2 Each of us should please our neighbors for their good, to build them up. 3 For even Christ did not please himself but, as it is written: “The insults of those who insult you have fallen on me.”[a] 4 For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope. 5 May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, 6 so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. 7 Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. 8 For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the Jews[b] on behalf of God’s truth, so that the promises made to the patriarchs might be confirmed 9 and, moreover, that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written: “Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles; I will sing the praises of your name.” 10 Again, it says, “Rejoice, you Gentiles, with his people.” 11 And again, “Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles; let all the peoples extol him.” 12 And again, Isaiah says, “The Root of Jesse will spring up, one who will arise to rule over the nations; in him the Gentiles will hope.” 13 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

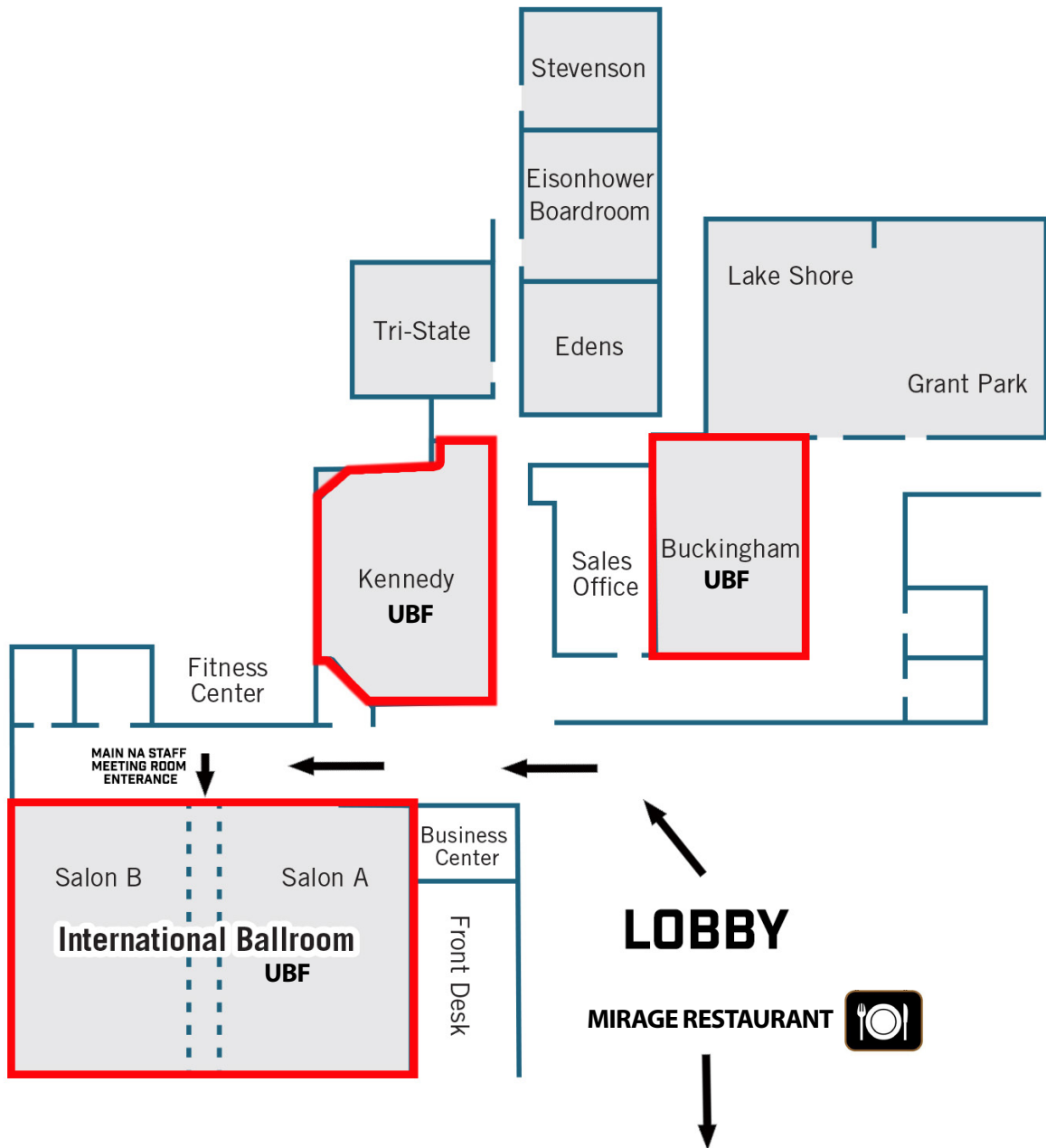
